2 was or was/an office of profit under the Constitution  
3 as it is today. The conclusion on that question was  
4 that it was one of doubt. We did not obtain a  
5 formal opinion from the Attorney General. We did consult  
6 the Attorney General informally. He inclined to the  
7 view that the office of delegate would be an office  
8 under the language of the existing Constitution but  
9 said that there was support for the view that the  
10 office of delegate to a Constitutional Convention was  
11 an office over and beyond the Constitution. I merely  
12 make that as a comment pending Mrs. Bothe's suggestion.

13                   MRS. BOTHE: Says Constitution and laws  
14 and this is certainly the law under which a person would  
15 be elected to office of profit or trust.

16                   MR. MARTINEAU: Mr. Chairman, I am now  
17 convinced, and I will second the motion, that the oath  
18 in Section 6 of Article 1 --

19                   THE CHAIRMAN: Do you renew your motion?
