not was or was/an office of profit under the Constitution as it is today. The conclusion on that question was that it was one of doubt. We did not obtain a formal opinion from the Attorney General. We did consult the Attorney General informally. He inclined to the view that the office of delegate would be an office under the language of the existing Constitution but said that there was support for the view that the office of delegate to a Constitutional Convention was an office over and beyond the Constitution. I merely make that as a comment pending Mrs. Bothe's suggestion.

MRS. BOTHE: Says Constitution and laws and this is certainly the law under which a person would be elected to office of profit or trust.
