I see no objection to leaving out State Central Committee
myself but what I think is too bad is instead of saying
if no provision is made to fill the unexpired term for
such portion of the unexpired term until so that if
someone in the Legislature died in 1967, that in the
'68 election someone be elected for two years instead
of letting the Governor's appointee serve nearly three
vears.

DR. BARD: We feel the law could take care of that and it is unnecessary to put it in the constitution.

DR. BURDETTE: I agree but you put in a clause if there is no law this fellow serves three years if a vacancy turns up in the first year.

DR. BARD: I don't see the contradition.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Burdette's point is your second limitation providing for appointment by the Governor should be appointed by the Governor until the next general election which in effect would require the Legislature to elect to fill vacnacies.

MR. MARTINEAU: Why not leave it up to the
