in their newspaper prior to the election and the newspapers in Florida did in fact have special editions with the entire Constitution in it. This is not unusual practice and I would think that if the newspapers here did not do that kind of thing, that the League of Women Voters as well as probably the Secretary of State would put out copies for general distribution for anyone interested.

DR. JENKINS: I simply raise the question.

MR. GENTRY: It is said here the referendum shall be conducted according to general election laws of the State of Maryland which requires publication.

MR. BROOKS: That includes three newspapers in Baltimore, I believe.

MR. BOND: It seems Mr. Scanlan goes in great detail on publication of list of delegates. Why not go to the same detail on publication of the Constitution?

MR. SCANLAN: I think Mr. Gentry just enswered that. It has to follow the general rules
