And that's all. The present Constitution says that an amendment can be proposed by Convention but the Convention that the Constitution talks about is an entirely different type of Convention composed of different people and set up in a different way than this Convention would be. I am questioning now whether or not the amendment would be a valid amendment, whether it would be meaningful.

MR. SCANLAN: I think the greater includes the lesser and if one accepts the assumption, the Legislature has inherent power to convene that Convention and delegates who go there to serve in it are acting within powers, acting within the scope of constitutional authority and exercising inherent right of the people to change their constitutional form of government, if they can change it completely, I think they can change it in part.

MR. CASE:: I don't have with me the opinion of the Attorney General you recall was given to the Governor before the appointment of this Commission. You will recall that that opinion of the Attorney General
