the legal basis on which this whole Convention is to be convened. If you are right, and your skepticism turns out to be correct, then clearly the whole procedure is illegal.

MR. CASE: No, this is a completely

erroneous interpretation of what I am saying in an effort to protect your particular provision here. All I am trying to do is to see or hopefully see that this thing doesn't go down the drain by reason of some mistake we make now. I am not arguing with you. I am trying to be helpful in the sense that if we can obviate a bum argument which would come up later, now is the time to do it in this bill. Let's face the fact that if there are two ways of doing something, one which will cut away the arguments and won't hurt anything, this is the thing we ought to do.

MR. SCANLAN: There I will have to rest with the opinion of the Attorney General to which Mr. Eney referred.

MR. CASE: I will add I don't share the skepticism, you say some -- I suppose you speak of me --
