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I don't think that's right.

THE CHAIRMAN: You mean if the schedule provides for a deferring of the effective date? MR. HOFF: Yes.

THE CHAIRMAN: Isn't that a question if I followed Mr. Brooks' suggestion that the Convention would consider in adopting a schedule or in the language of the schedule. The Constitution itself will

MR. BROOKS:

state the date upon ratification that it will go into effect. That would not be a schedule item. The schedule, however, would provide for, for instance, a carry-over of legislative and executive and juducial salaries since they are being eliminated from the present Constitution until such time as the Legislature has an opportunity to provide some kind of law to replace what otherwise has been in the Constitution theretofore. That's the kind of material that would be in a schedule. JUDGE ADKINS: Does this word schedule have

a sufficiently precise meaning in constitutional law to be intelligible? A schedule to me normally means a
