
the Convention could observe after it had been organized and our Committee has examined rules of the House Representatives of the United States Congress, the rules of the House Delegates and rules of the Senate, and the rules of the Rhode Island Constitution Convention. I believe it fair to say the Committee's, some lethargy on the Committee's part stems from the fact that some of them regard this as a make work project. The other arises out of the concern that maybe if this Commission were to draft a full-fledged set of rules to give to the Convention some might feel we are usurping the functions of the Convention.

It has some advantage, of course, in having rules ready made to observe as soon as the Convention begins to operate. On the other hand, the way we drafted this bill, we will have the summer to organize, and we will follow Roberts Rules of Orders until they do organize and in that summer, perhaps they can work out different rules if they don't prefer to follow Roberts Rules of Orders.
