2 MR. BROOKS: One further word about the useful-
3 ness of some rules. The one recommendation we received
4 above all others from both the Rhode Island and Michigan
5 people involved in a convention was that we could seriously
6 consider preparing some recommended rules that the Conven-
7 tion might use as a base. Because this wasn't done in
8 Rhode Island, the Rhode Island convention / ^{is} practically
9 bogged down. It is still in session. There is no hope of
10 their ever coming up with a product, and it is a matter
11 of months before it dies completely. In Michigan, they
12 had a great deal of difficulty. They were never really
13 satisfied with their rules, and it was some of the recom-
14 mendations of alterations in their rules that prompted
15 Rhode Island to adopt basically the Michigan rules with
16 a few changes that didn't prove to add anything and
17 hindered the concept of operations even more.

18 But in light of the recommendation yesterday
19 that the Convention keep a record of its transactions
20 which is also a proposition that was originally desirable
21 in Michigan and Rhode Island, the fact that the Convention
