There is no hope of their ever coming up with a product, and it is a matter of months before it dies completely. In Michigan, they had a great deal of difficulty. They were never really satisfied with their rules, and it was some of the recommendations of alterations in their rules that prompted Rhode Island to adopt basically the Michigan rules with a few changes that didn't prove to add anything and
