THE CHAIRMAN: That concludes the consideration of the Sixth Report of the Committee on Convention Procedures. We will now proceed to a consideration of the Fifth Report of the Committee on Miscellaneous Provisions.

MR. BROOKS: Is there anyone that doesn't have a copy of the Report?

THE CHAIRMAN: This is the Report dated October 14, 1966.

Mrs. Bothe?

MRS. BOTHE: Mr. Chairman, the Fifth Report of the Committee on Miscellaneous Provisions deals with the education provisions of the Constitution. The Fourth Report of the Committee which was submitted at the July meeting in Easton also gave recommendations regarding education. There was some discussion at the July meeting which resulted in agreement of the Commission with the Committee on certain matters of principle, but no definitive action was taken. Since that time, the Committee has considerably reviewed the material and thinking contained in the Fourth Report and has completely revised that Report although there has been no substantial change in the
