position taken by the Committee at the July meeting, and in that Report.

I might say there is one change or one deletion that was made by the Committee as a result of action taken by the Commission at the July meeting. We originally had recommended that there be a section of the education article prohibiting discrimination in the school system. In view of the fact that the Commission in the Declaration of Rights proposing a general prohibition, we felt that such a provision in the education article would be redundant and not necessary, so that we have not put forward that recommendation at this time.

Otherwise, the substance of our Report or the substantial recommendations in our Report are the same, although the reasoning is somewhat different. The existing education provisions of the Constitution are reproduced in the Report on Page 2. They consist of Article VIII of the Constitution which is devoted entirely to the subject of education in three sections and Article 43 of the Declaration of Rights which is a general exhortation to encourage the diffusion of knowledge and virtue, et
