2 in that Report.

3 I might say there is one change or one deletion
4 that was made by the Committee as a result of action taken
5 by the Commission at the July meeting. We originally
6 had recommended that there be a section of the education
7 article prohibiting discrimination in the school system.
8 In view of the fact that the Commission in the Declara-
9 tion of Rights proposing a general prohibition, we felt
10 that such a provision in the education article would be
11 redundant and not necessary, so that we have not put
12 forward that recommendation at this time.

13 Otherwise, the substance of our Report or the
14 substantial recommendations in our Report are the same,
15 although the reasoning is somewhat different. The exist-
16 ing education provisions of the Constitution are repro-
17 duced in the Report on Page 2. They consist of Article
18 VIII of the Constitution which is devoted entirely to
19 the subject of education in three sections and Article 43
20 of the Declaration of Rights which is a general exhortation
21 to encourage the diffusion of knowledge and virtue, et
