of literature, has had many contacts with the administrative and teaching personnel in the State School System. We know the hearing last March at which some twenty different persons appeared that representatives of the educational institutions and of the general public to give us suggestions as to what they felt should be and shouldn't be in the education article -- and after surveying the situation certain issues developed which we felt were the vital ones we had to deal with. Now, starting on Page 4 and going on to Page 5 of the Report are listed what we found to be the basic issues as presented to us. We considered these for inclusion in an education article for the new Constitution.

The first of them dealt with Section 3 of

Article VIII. That is a statement -- oh, I might say
in addition to the provisions on Page 2, there were also
the very significant provisions contained in Article III,
Section 52, which the Commission acted on yesterday on
the recommendation of the Committee on Finance and Taxation, and the recommendation adopted by the Commission
was that which our Committee felt should have been continued
