

1 is affording are constantly changing and expanding and
2 that while there should be recognition of the State's
3 support of education outside of the standard grade school
4 and elementary school level, that it should be done through
5 a general exhortation such as we have placed in Section 1.

6 We have made a separate section out of the
7 exhortation for the reason that we want to separate the
8 concept of encouragement of education from that of man-
9 datory education which is what we place in Section 2. We
10 feel that this statement takes care of some of the com-
11 mentary made at the July meeting that there might be some
12 danger if the elementary school mandate were mixed with
13 the balance of the educational program and offered
14 publicly there might be a danger/^{of} someone complaining
15 education at any level as a matter of right.

16 This does away with that problem and implies
17 it in the recommendation as a rejection, happily of the
18 right to education beyond the elementary school level at
19 State expense.
