

1 the rest of their life and due to circumstances, most of
2 these things can be governed by laws of the Legislature.

3 THE CHAIRMAN: Let me request we not discuss the
4 school age question any more.

5 Mr. Clagett?

6 MR. CLAGETT: I can't skip the impression, and
7 I would like to have it clarified, Mrs. Freedlander,
8 whether the gist of your dissent here wouldn't be a
9 matter for consideration by the Committee on Style?

10 MRS. FREEDLANDER: No.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: I would answer it goes beyond
12 the mere matter of style. I think the type of change
13 recommended by Mrs. Freedlander is greater than the Com-
14 mittee on Style would feel free to attempt.

15 MR. CLAGETT: Then I would ask Mrs. Bothe if
16 she hasn't refused the principle that the Commission is
17 trying to follow, short, concise, direct expression.

18 MRS. BOTHE: Perhaps we have, but then I think
19 if we are going to have an education article at all that
20 we are going to have to allow for some latitude in this
