MR. MELVIN: May I ask a question, Mr.
Chairman? I direct this to Al Scanlan. He is probably
more knowledgeable than most on this subject. What is
the present law as to how any changes are to be made
in the numbers? Does the present law, the one that
provides for 142 in one House and 43 in the other, provide
a formula for increasing it.

MR. SCANLAN: Yes, it has a formula. Not on the Senatorial district but on the House side there is a formula but by guaranteeing each at least one, each county one member of one, it in effect places limitation on the formula. The formula is called the --where is our statistician -- formula of equal proportions. In effect, it is misleading because there is a minimum that can't be disturbed. Therefore, in practical effect it means that it will stay the way it is.
