educational facilities on whatever terms it can to as many people as possible while Section 2 commands the existence of a Statewide secondary school system open to all.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any questions?

Mr. Miller?

MR. MILLER: I would just like to hark back to the question of children. Would your theory be that a returned veteran of twenty-five who wanted to finish high school would not per se have a right to go to public school?

MRS. BOTHE: I don't believe, Congressman, that he would have. I would hope he would be able to,

MR. MILLER: If he wasn't a veteran; he probably is a veteran, he might have GI education, but suppose somebody for some reason or other is twenty-five years old, but they want to finish high school.

MRS. BOTHE: He can finish high school hopefully at State expense. He is not the person who is covered under Section 2. Now, it may be that in the next
