something because maybe people would send their dogs and

cats.

MR. MILLER: All persons or citizens or resi-

dents.

MRS. BOTHE: We like the word, children, because education is basically directed toward youth and childhood, and the importance of this Section is that they offer an opportunity for everyone to achieve an education during his youth.

MR. MILLER: The thing that occurs to me is that if a twenty-year old boy, had every reason he wanted to go to the local high school for some reason or other, might under this be told, You are not a child: You are too old to be a child. That is the only concern I have that it might be negating the right of an older person to go to a free school.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Mindel?

MR. MINDEL: Congressman, I think you are a little confused. I think you have in mind, we have in mind a compulsory school age, but there are many, many students of twenty, twenty-one and twenty-two who are still
