2 the word, children, had been used here, and there would
3 be many who would say the Constitution does not provide
4 for this. I have another statutory possibility. I see
5 no reason why we can't say, all of the school age, no
6 matter which particular form we adopt, whether it be
7 Mrs. Freedlander's or the Committee's proposal. So I am
8 suggesting and perhaps a motion is in order later on that
9 this matter of children is not a perfunctory term. Those
10 of us who work with young adults know that it comes up
11 over and over again when we get before legislative bodies
12 in respect to whether the Constitution did have this
13 sort of thing in mind. I would propose the deletion of
14 that word.

16 MR. BOND: I would like to ask the mover of
17 the motion if she would accept the substitution of the
18 word, people, for the word, citizens, in the next to last
19 line.

20 THE CHAIRMAN: Let's get that as a separate
21 motion, if you don't mind.
