

1 MR. SCANLAN: I believe Mrs. Freedlander does
2 have, citizens of the State.

3 THE CHAIRMAN: I am sorry. I thought you were
4 talking about the same point as Dr. Bard. Any further
5 questions as to Section 2?

6 MRS. BOTHE: I would like to make a brief
7 comment on Dr. Bard's remark. If the word, children,
8 were struck, school age being the wide open term that it
9 is, it would be conceivable that anyone could say that
10 I am school age. We are all school age in this room if
11 there isn't some qualification, I think many of us are
12 taking courses in schools and consider ourselves suscep-
13 tible to public education.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Judge Adkins?

15 JUDGE ADKINS: A relatively minor point, but
16 in Section 2, it seems to me the responsibility sought
17 to be imposed in that Section should be imposed on the
18 State and not the General Assembly. It is not the
19 responsibility of the General Assembly. It is the respon-
20 sibility of the State of Maryland acting through the
