

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Clagett?

2 MR. CLAGETT: Recalling the eloquence of
3 Mr. Case at one point when we were dealing with the
4 Declaration of Rights and we had the alignment of Mr.
5 Gentry and Mr. Case, it would be most interesting to see
6 how Mr. Case votes as a comparison here, because there is
7 the flavor in Sections 1 and 2 of something which he was
8 exhorting upon us back there at the time of the Declara-
9 tion of Rights.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sayre?

11 MR. SAYRE: The question that I would like
12 clarified by the Committee -- when we talk about a system
13 that doesn't preclude plural, does it? We could have two
14 systems and so forth? Then, I am asking you, Leah, on
15 this part where you say, shall also provide for other
16 public institutions, that is almost as if you have taken
17 it out of the system.

18 MRS. FREEDLANDER: The first part is free pub-
19 lic systems, elementary and secondary schools. The
20 second part provides for adult education, anything that
21 would apply to other than children of school age as we
