

1 provisions we adopted yesterday, does in fact, appropriate  
2 money and without the General Assembly, it couldn't begin  
3 at all and without the Governor it couldn't begin. So I  
4 feel it is self-evident and furthermore, we do have the  
5 precedent in the existing Constitution, it does say the  
6 General Assembly, and I think we ought to continue that.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Section 1 as just deleted said  
8 the State.

9 Mr. Scanlan?

10 MR. SCANLAN: If we are going to elevate here  
11 the right of education to a Constitution right, it should  
12 be a right that holds in the State as a whole and not  
13 just any particular branch of the Government. On that  
14 grounds, I support Judge Adkins' motion.

15 MRS. BOTHE: I see at least one Member of the  
16 Committee won't go along with me, but since her substituted  
17 amendment has been adopted, I would feel that the State  
18 is the better term.

19 THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Burdette?

20 DR. BURDETTE: I would like to suggest that  
21 the word, State, has additional advantages. I rather
