MR. CLAGETT: Congressman Miller, what would be the understanding if we left out the word, children, and said, all of elementary school age?

MR. MILLER: Suit me fine.

MR. MINDEL: I don't think so.

THE CHAIRMAN: That would eliminate all secondary schools, high schools.

Dr. Bard?

Before Dr. Bard closes, I would like to make a comment. My initial reaction was that the substitution of the word, persons, would be desirable. Listening to the discussion, I am very apprehensive, and I call your attention to the fact that the first clause provides compulsory system of free public schools. I do not think that necessarily means a school in the sense that we are thinking of it today as a school for the education of children because we refer to the School of Law, the School of Dertistry, the School of Pharmacy, the School of Medicine and many other schools, and we also have elaborate educational programs for adults. I would fear that if you left out the word, children, or put the word, persons, in place
