of children, you would be requiring the State to maintain a system of free public schools for all persons of whatever age the courts might ultimately determine would be within the meaning of the term, school age. I point out to you the second clause which is not mandatory but permissive, and a little more than permissive, gives ample power to the Legislature to provide for adult education or free professional school education, but does not compel it.

Dr. Bard?

DR. BARD: We have talked a good deal about the fact that this particular Section should have the elasticity so that there would be the possibility of providing for very young children, perhaps even those of two or three years of age, and I think by deleting the word, children, and putting the emphasis on, school age, so this might be interpreted as the Legislature so finds necessary in the terms of the times, and my own feeling as an educator is that this whole phrase, school age, is being reinterpreted almost daily, certainly yearly, that giving it that elasticity is highly important.
