

1           MR. CLAGETT: Going back to the question  
2 Mr. Scanlan asked a moment ago insofar as political  
3 subdivisions or other divisions, whatever definition  
4 may be given in the future to that, they are subject to  
5 general law and as I understood your answer in reply to  
6 his question here, you would not be subject to general  
7 law, it would be unconstitutional. I don't quite under-  
8 stand that.

9           MRS. BOTHE: I am not quite sure I understand  
10 your question. I don't feel there is any analogy between  
11 the establishment of the University and these various  
12 political subdivisions which will be established as the  
13 government of the people civilly and generally. This  
14 would be a constitutional bar, so to speak, but not a  
15 government or area of government.

16           MR. CLAGETT: How does it differ from an  
17 authority then?

18           MRS. BOTHE: You have a number of parallels,  
19 both with an authority and with a political subdivision.  
20 However, the fact is, it would have some analogous powers  
21 and would not make it in conflict either with the balance
