the budget making procedure in relation to appropriations and specifically direct their attention to whether or not appropriations once made by the Legislature for a prescribed program would then be subject to the complete control of the Board of Regents without reference to the program which was proposed at the time of the adoption. That is a lot of words, but what I am trying to say is, can they divert the funds?

MR. CASE: I think to answer, I ought to give the Commission some insight as to just what happens and how the University's budget is made up, and then what happens after it is passed by the Legislature.

The first step, of course, is the meetings held with the President, members of his staff and the department heads for the purpose of determining what would be the requirements of a given program for a given year and after these have been prescribed by the budget and a list is in the President's office, a budget book is compiled and that budget book then is submitted to the Board of Regents.

The Board of Regents then holds hearings with
