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THE CHAIRMAN: You move the amendmenc?

JUDGE ADKINS: I move the amendment of the report to simply provide that after reapportionment -- I don't really think that's necessary because I think it goes with it -- what I would do would not impose a limit as the result of the 1970 census, I would give the Legislature the right to reapportion itself after the 1970 census without regard to any arbitrary limits imposed at this time.

THE CHARMAN: Is there a second?

MR. MELVIN: Second.

DR. BARD: Might I clarify this point. If that be true then, Judge Adkins, all you would need, would be sentence one?

JUDGE ADKINS: I think that is what I was thinking about.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion?

Ready for the question? All those in favor signify
by saying aye. Opposed, no. The ayes have it.

DR. BARD: Legislative districts, number ten.

Our recommendation is that the state should be divided
