Committee proposes it, would the University have complete control over the establishment of tuition, the amount of tuition? MRS. BOTHE: Yes.

THE CHAIRMAN: Would the University, by which I mean the Regents, have complete control over the location of branches of the University? MRS. BOTHE: Yes, it would, subject, of course,

to the Legislature's appropriation. There is a great deal of discussion about what would happen if the University didn't use the funds for the purpose represented in the Legislature, but I think it has to be kept in mind that the University must come back every year to ask for more, and if they represent that they want funds to put up a fine arts building and then put the thing down in Cumberland or something, the next time they ask for a building, I doubt if they will be so successful. This

what we understand, there has been virtually none under the Autonomy Act. DR. JENKINS: Mr. Chairman --
