MR. CASE: The complete answer to that is that a university cannot build any building, can't put any branch of the university anywhere unless and until the General Assembly authorizes the capital funds for such building or for such branch.

In other words, when we had the big to-do about where the branches were to be located, actually it was not necessary to have a declaration from the Legislature that a branch should be put in Baltimore County. The Board of Regents could have sat over here in the meeting room and said, We are going to put a branch in Baltimore County, but if they didn't get the necessary funds from the Legislature to buy the land and put the building up, we have no funds to do anything like that with, so the Legislature has absolute control over the location of branches through the appropriation of capital funds.

THE CHAIRMAN: My next question, and I am putting these --

DR. JENKINS: Mr. Chairman, I was going to state the same thing Mr. Case stated. Further, the Legislature has the control in the succeeding year. Let's say
