

1 MRS. BOTHE: No.

2 THE CHAIRMAN: Before we actually act on the  
3 motion, can we have or take a sense of the meeting as  
4 to whether most people want to consider amendments  
5 first or not because I cannot rule out of order a motion  
6 for a substitute to an amendment, but I would assume that  
7 if the great preponderance of Members of the Commission  
8 would prefer not to consider amendments right now, that  
9 most Members would follow that.

10 DR. BARD: The only thing I would like to say  
11 is that nothing has been said here this morning at all  
12 in regard to the possibility of a substitute motion which  
13 would to my mind strengthen all of the arguments that  
14 have been proposed in favor of the motion, and therefore,  
15 it would be unfair as I would see it to deal with the  
16 motion until we consider the possibility of strengthen-  
17 ing it.
