2 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Bond?

3 MR. BOND: I would like to point out according
4 to Dr. Elkins' letter, there were seven States, not three,
5 that have put this constitutional safeguard in. I would
6 also like to say from my own personal experience as a
7 graduate of the Law School and who went to the Law School
8 twenty years ago when the Law School was more or less
9 undermined and not thought very highly of by my under-
10 graduate school, only until autonomy came forth in 1952
11 has the undergraduate school and the whole University
12 prospered.

13 I think we should continue to help the Univer-
14 sity, and I see no objection to putting it in. I don't
15 think it is a lot of putter in the Constitution. It is
16 an important and integral part of the Constitution.

17 THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Burdette?
