for this type of policy as proposed to the Committee. 1 2 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Della? MR. DELLA: Mr. Chairman, I have no real 3 4 problem about this Section, but I think it really is not necessary to be put in the Constitution. The University 5 of Maryland through its actions has progressed over the 6 years to a great extent of success, and by the autonomous 7 power granted to it since 1952. If we put this in the 8 9 Constitution, the University of Maryland, the State 10 institutions would have just as much right to come in 11 for the same recognition. I don't think they are in the 12 position to have the maturity to be put in, but I feel 13 as long as the University of Maryland is progressing as it has that it is not necessary to have it in the Consti-14 15 tution. 16 17 18
