2 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Della?

3 MR. DELLA: Mr. Chairman, I have no real
4 problem about this Section, but I think it really is not
5 necessary to be put in the Constitution. The University
6 of Maryland through its actions has progressed over the
7 years to a great extent of success, and by the autonomous
8 power granted to it since 1952. If we put this in the
9 Constitution, the University of Maryland, the State
10 institutions would have just as much right to come in
11 for the same recognition. I don't think they are in the
12 position to have the maturity to be put in, but I feel
13 as long as the University of Maryland is progressing as
14 it has that it is not necessary to have it in the Consti-
15 tution.
