DR. BARD: Three separate questions. The one dealing with compact and contiguous territory, I don't think, will have debate. Secondly is the one dealing with variation from the mean, third the --

THE CHAIRMAN: Let's take up the first, approval of the Committee's report as to compact and contiguous district. Those in favor signify by saying aye, contrary, no. So ordered.

The next is the recommendation that there be a variation of not more than 5 per cent from the mean population of each district. Any discussion?

DR. BURDETTE: I would allude to comment made by Judge Adkins. I think I am correct that while we have no absolute guide lines from the Supreme Court, people are now talking somewhere about 15 per cent or higher.

MR. SCANLAN: I was once but the District Court here went far from that.

DR. BURDETTE: Maybe there are guide lines from the District Court. I want to raise for discussion whether or not Judge Adkins' point of representation of
