with law in the first phrase in light of the second two phrases, and the explanations of the Committee have not relieved my mind of the doubts. Also it seems to me that the last two clauses in constitutional language grant complete and unfettered control. Mr. Scanlan, you want to close?

GOVERNOR LANE: May I say something?

THE CHAIPMAN: I am sorry.

GOVERNOR LANE: My confusion about it is that we have had numerous troubles that the University has, but since 1952 from what has been said, increasingly the University has been assisted, or to put it in a few words, has been granted legislative autonomy. Could this be accomplished by a review or presentation to the Legislature to expand the autonomy rather than to put it in the Constitution which to a great extent is irrevocable? I think there should be a tie between the representatives of the people with respect not only to the University, but with all the other branches of the Government, so that we don't wind up gradually by having the head of the Government or its operation out of control.
