MR. CLAGETT: Mr. Chairman, I listened carefully to the pros and cons. I thought it boiled down to a simple issue of whether you were voting for constitutional autonomy or statutory autonomy, and then I moved one step further and came to the conclusion that constitutional autonomy deserved a progress and development and state of affairs which was good and would continue to be made better, and therefore voted against the motion.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further explanation of the votes? Mrs. Bothe, anything further with respect to your Report?

DR. JENKINS: Mr. Chairman, I want to make a motion.

THE CHAIRMAN: Go ahead.

DR. JENKINS: I move the following statement appear in the record and minutes of the Commission, and I doubt this will take very much time. The rejection by the Commission of provision for constitutional autonomy for the University and other interested State colleges is not to be construed as disapproval of provision for
