Without going to the full extent of Section 3, their answer at that time was No, and in accordance with that answer, I voted for Mr. Scanlan's motion. I do not favor autonomy. If there is something less than full autonomy that can be helpful in the situation, I might be prepared to accept it. I do not think that that opportunity ought to be forclosed on an 11 to 10 vote.
