matter and I think if we can delete a sentence out of here without interfering with the actual meaning of the Constitution, I think we better do it.

THE CHAIRMN: My concern goes further than that. What bothers me is the notion that by creating a division, you seem to be at war with the idea of one statewide court.

MR. MARTINEAU: I see the problem and agree with your concern.

MR. CLAGETT: That had not occurred to me. When I read this, I went back and re-read the same sentence and I felt my mind satisfied that there was a Judge and there was a court and everything went along fine, but I will not object to it.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Hargrove.

MR. HARGROVE: I think perhaps we could combine the three sentences because the state shall be divided by law into districts composed of one or more entire or continuous counties. I think we have three separate thoughts that can be combined. And it says which shall be located at the District Court.
