MR. CLAGETT: I didn't read that as assigning it to him.

THE CHAIRMAN: Certified by him.

MR. MARTINEAU: Obviously he is not going to prepare it individually. Some part of the administrative office of the court is going to have to prepare the budget. The individual Judge couldn't possibly do it.

MR. CLAGETT: My question is, is it possible that the Chief Justice in assigning the administrative responsibilities to the Chief Judge of the Superior Court should not give him anything that acquaints him and makes it a basis for him to certify.

MR. MARTINFAU: He is necessarily going to have to be familiar with the operation of the judicial system. He is the principal assistant to the Chief Justice and the administrator of the judicial system.

I don't see how he cannot be familiar with it.

MR. CLAGETT: That as a practicality is certainly true but there is a loophole there. There is a possibility he may be sent off to St. Marys County and
