3 (d) is just some contrary language or to serve as acting
4 Governor.

5 JUDGE / DIXONS: Let us assume that the
6 Governor and the Lieutenant Governor and the President
7 of the Senate are all three killed in an automobile
8 accident. The President of the Senate ex officio
9 would under the terms of this article of succession,
10 succeeds to the office of Governor. There is, however,
11 no president of the Senate. Therefore, the Senate
12 convenes for the purpose of electing a President of
13 the Senate who would then succeed to the office of
14 Governor. The same thing would apply if the Governor
15 became disabled, and there were no Lieutenant Governor
16 and no President of the Senate.

17 DR. BURDETTE: Well, in that case, I see.
