administrative letting it read any department, office or agency.

THE CHAIRMAN: That would embrace then any judicial department, for instance, or the legislative department?

JUDGE ADKINS: Yes.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any objection to striking the word administrative? The effect of this would be to give the Governor power to require information in writing or otherwise from members of the judicial department, members of the legislative department and members of the executive department.

MR. BROOKS: Those are branches, I would think.

MR. SCANLAN: I would object to that.

It carries the implication that the Governor could request from the Judge of this state the basis on which he reached a decision in a particular case and I would prefer it pertain only to the executive or administrative department. What the Legislature does and what the judicial does is none of the Governor's business unless
