THE CHAIRMAN: I would assume if the Governor wanted to find out the basis for a Judge's

decision, he would read his opinion.

MR. SCANLAN: Yes, but this language can be interpreted that the Governor would have the power to inquire further.

MR. MARTINEAU: Could this be cleared up by having it read relating to the operation of their respective offices which is what I think you probably mean. I think there is a reason for requiring this because the executive has the responsibility for making up the budget of these departments. It seems to me the Governor has every right to say you are asking me for ten clerks in this office. Why do you need ten clerks?

MR. SCANLAN: Other provisions deal with how the budget and Legislature are transmitted to the Governor. Doesn't the intention of the Committee as it is originally drafted, leaving aside the language that appears here, wasn't the intention of the Committee
