

1 to really give the power to the Governor to require  
2 anybody and for the Governor to state whether it be  
3 the judicial or Legislature to furnish this information.

4 JUDGE ADKINS: No, to give the Governor the  
5 right to acquire information from any administrative  
6 or executive department of the state. Mr. Power just  
7 pointed something out to me which I hadn't realized.  
8 If you strike out the word administrative, it could give  
9 the Governor the right to ask for advisory opinions from  
10 the Supreme Court which I would at least not favor.  
11 So I would suggest that we go back to the proposal  
12 executive and administration department, office or  
13 agency.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: I am not sure I follow you  
15 when you say go back to. You are talking about Section  
16 9(b) and the only word used there is administrative.

17 JUDGE ADKINS: That we add the word executive  
18 before administrative.

19 THE CHAIRMAN: And your present suggestion is  
20 to do what.

21 JUDGE ADKINS: Make it read executive,
