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the Governor instead of through the department heads and I am dubious of it.

THE CHAIRMAN: I wouldn't go quite that far that they report directly to him, it means he can bypass the head of the department or the intermediate head if he chooses to do so.

DR.BURDETTE: But should we make this a constitutional provision in the state?

THE CHAIRMAN: Are you asking me? I would, yes. Judge Adkins.

JUDGE ADKINS: We thought so. It is in most constitutions. It is in the model constitution and our committee felt that it was a constitutional dimension and hence, we have so recommended it.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Jenkins.

DR. JENKINS: As administrative officer, I certainly agree and am sympathetic to Dr. Burdette but I do think the Governor must have the right to address inquiries to anyone.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion?
