

1 into which the state, which the state shall be organized.
2 As you know, that matter is now under study by a
3 Commission appointed by Governor Tawes. We have tried
4 to get such help as we could from that Commission in
5 terms of drafting this reorganization power. One of
6 the principal matters that we debated was whether or
7 not we should, as many Constitutions do, and as indeed
8 the model proposes, recommend a limitation as to the
9 number of principal departments. We rejected that
10 idea on the theory that any number would be more or
11 less arbitrary and that it was not really essential.
12 We have provided that the regulatory boards which fall
13 into somewhat of a separate category should not
14 necessarily be assigned within a principal department.
15 This is preliminary to, it may turn out to be a somewhat
16 more controversial problem occurring in our next session.
17 Perhaps we should limit ourselves to a discussion of
18 these two sections.

19 THE CHAIRMAN: Judge Adkins, I take it
20 that by the use of the term executive and administrative
21 offices, agencies and instrumentalities, it is intended
