| 7 | MR. SAYRE: All functions and duties that |
| 8 | fall within the responsibility of the executive depart- |
| 9 | ment. |
| 10 | MR. BOND: No, no. |
| 11 | THE CHAIRMAN: It doesn't help me. It |
| 12 | may help some of the others. I was going to suggest |
| 13 | that we, if we agreed on the queston of principle that |
| 14 | we leave to the Committee and its reporter the matter |
| 15 | of working out the best phraseology to accomplish that |
| 16 | MRS, BOTHE: I second it. |
| 17 | DR.BARD: So moved. |
| 18 | THE CHAIRMAN: All right, any further |
| 19 | question or comment with respect to Section (a)? |
| 20 | DR. JENKINS: I have a comment. The last |
| 23 | sentence in (n) is superfluous. What does this add? |
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
