2 JUDGE ADKINS: We thought it was, I won't
3 say essential. We certainly thought it was helpful in
4 view of the reference later to the power of the
5 Governor to appoint chief administrative officers in
6 addition to the power to appoint chief executive
7 officers.

8 DR. JENKINS: I don't feel strongly about
9 it. It seems to me to be unnecessary.

10 JUDGE ADKINS: We would prefer to see
11 the language left in, in view of the later impact.

12 DR. BURDETTE: One I don't understand is
13 does this mean, for instance, that some means of choosing
14 this officer could be set up by law so that the Governor
15 could not reorganize? What does it mean?

16 JUDGE ADKINS: Well, may I use a concrete
17 example? It means, for example, that if the Racing
18 Commission is headed by a board of three, as I think
19 it currently is, that the Legislature could provide
20 that while --

21 MR. CLAGETT: There are five.
