Once those principal departments were established, the Governor would then have the right to appoint and discharge the heads of those principal offices.

MRS. BOTHE: For instance, the Board of Regents at the University of Maryland.

JUDGE ADKINS: That would not be covered

MRS. BOTHE: You have exempted the press.

JUDGE ADKINS: No, we have provided the term of boards can be as the Legislature can provide, provided that only half of them shall be available during his administration. They would serve a term. They would not be subject to being fired at will. They would all be subject to being appointed, serving their full term.

THE CHAIRMAN: In the case of Regents, the governor presently appoints.

JUDGE ADKINS: Yes.
