statutory legislation relating to the boards would be so drawn that the terms of half of the members of the board would expire coincident with the new Governor taking office. It may be a distinction without a difference.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Scanlan.

MR. SCANLAN: That was my question, Dale. Do you intend that immediately upon taking office, the appointments would be so prescribed by law that at once he could, that the 50 per cent would go out or is it your intention during his first term after taking office he would be in position to replace 50 per cent?

JUDGE ADKINS: The terms of the boards would be coincident with the gubernatorial term, so coincident with the demise of the old chief executive, at least half of the members of the board would go so a new Governor taking office would have at least 50 per cent of his own appointees to each of the major policy making boards.
